## British School Games

## Overview

Students will get an authentic British school experience by learning some classic British school games. Activities include sports such as rounders, continuous cricket, dodgeball and games such as capture the flag or football golf. There will also be a range of indoor activities such as Tiddlywinks, card games and board games. This elective is a great way to have fun, try something new and experience some British culture in a relaxed and friendly environment.

For younger students (7-11), this elective will include popular playground games such as tag, parachute games, "cops and robbers", bucket ball and many more. There is an emphasis on fun, fair play and building confidence.

## Learning Outcomes

Students will have:

- learned how to play some common British school games.
- learned some new ideas to share with their friends at home.
- be able to show respect, fair play and cooperate with team-mates.


## Language Outcomes:

Students will be able to:

- name sports equipment and use key verbs to describe actions.
- communicate with team mates to ask for the ball or to tell them what to do.
- understand the rules of a new game when stated clearly at normal speed.
