

Elective: Exam skills

Overview

This elective is for students who want to improve their ability to do English exams and tests in reading, writing, speaking and listening. It will be particularly useful for students who will be taking the Cambridge exam suite as it focuses on a many of the types of questions that appear in these exams. Students will also learn general exam strategies and study skills.

Learning Outcomes

Students will:

- be better able to answer different types of reading, writing, listening and speaking exam questions for the Cambridge Exams and other exam types.
- have learned general strategies to improve their exam technique e.g. time management, planning answers, understanding the question etc.

Language Outcomes:

Students will:

- be better able to answer cloze and gap-fill reading questions
- be better able to write short and longer compositions for written exams.
- be able to transform words (e.g. change them from a noun to a verb, or an adjective to an adverb) using common affixes and suffixes e.g. definite -> definitely
- have practised listening for specific information from dialogues and monologues.
- be better able to maintain a conversation.

Electives Tuition: 18 hours	Chosen elective . Students choose 3 electives per course. Language learning is integrated into all these activities. Students each receive a handbook containing instructions, tips, activities and language tasks.

Evening Events: 20 hours	Evening events . The students usually come together as a group for the evening programme. Students participate in range of creative games, contests and shows which encourage team work, cooperation and above all communication in English.
