Payment of course

Fee balance

Full fees are due six weeks before your course begins, or at the time of booking if within six weeks of your course start date. We cannot guarantee to hold a place for you on your course or in your accommodation unless your fees are paid in full. You will also need to show the immigration authorities proof that you have paid your fees.

Unless otherwise stated, you are not automatically entered for exams, as they are held externally. Places are subject to availability and not guaranteed. Exam entrance fee

Now that your course booking is confirmed, there are a few things you may need to think about ahead of your study travel. Here are a few of the main areas that you should consider to help you prepare.

Tuition fees do not include exam entrance fees unless otherwise stated.

If you wish to enter for an exam you should bring extra money with you to cover the cost.

Please note: all students wishing to enter for an exam must bring a valid passport for exam entry. National identity cards may not be accepted in the UK.

Medical care

If you are from an EU country, please bring your EHIC card with you in order to claim for any medical expenses. Please note: if you have a medical condition or need any type of medication while you are in Britain, please let us know before you arrive in the UK.

Visa & immigration

If you are a non-EU national, you must check to see if you need a visa to travel to the UK, you can check at www.gov.uk/apply-uk-visa

Multiple entry visa

If you need a visa and want to leave the UK to return home for a holiday or travel during your period of study, you must obtain a multiple entry visa for the UK.

Travelling to other countries in Europe

If you need a visa and want to travel in Europe during your period of study, you should obtain this before arrival.

The Schengen visa allows you to visit the following countries: Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland.

You need to apply for a visa at the embassy of the country where you will spend the most time. Applying for a Schengen visa once you are in the UK can take several weeks. We strongly advise that you obtain your Schengen visa from your own country before arrival.

Bell Online

When you arrive at Bell, you will receive log-in details for Bell Online, our learning management system that gives you access to a range of resources that supplement the language learning you do in the classroom. Activities allow you to practice and recycle the same language you have been learning in class, and weekly topical lessons help you to expand your vocabulary. You will also be able to see your timetable, view and edit your learning journal, and sign up for Language in Action trips and activities.



Accommodation

You should arrive in your accommodation the day before your classes start and depart the day after your classes end. Sunday is the standard arrival day. Please check your confirmation documents before arranging travel.

Notifying us of a delay

If you are delayed, it is important to let us know. If you are in homestay accommodation please contact your homestay host if possible, otherwise please telephone the Bell emergency number: +44 (0) 1580 879100.

Early arrival

If you need to arrive earlier than the course arrival day, you must check with us in advance as your chosen accommodation may not be available early.

If we can arrange for you to arrive early at your chosen accommodation, you will be invoiced for the extra night(s) and asked to pay as per the standard terms and conditions

(www.bellenglish.com/terms-policies/).

If you need any extra accommodation, we can help you arrange a hotel or a guesthouse for the additional night(s).

As soon as your reservation is confirmed, you will need to pay the hotel or guesthouse direct as Bell is unable to pass on payment details.

Stay over Christmas

If you wish to remain in your accommodation during the Christmas period, please contact us for availability. If staying in your accommodation is not possible, we can recommend alternative options. Students who are away over the Christmas period but wish to retain their homestay accommodation must pay a retainer fee of £32 per week. For further information, please contact

Homestay accommodation

If you have chosen homestay accommodation, details of your homestay will be sent to you before arrival. This will include information about meals and laundry.

We consider all requests when placing a student with a homestay host, most importantly those relating to health or diet. We will do our best to meet any other request you have made but cannot guarantee this.

All homestay hosts are different. Some may be families with a mother,

father and children, but the term homestay or family can also mean a couple, a widow, a single parent, a retired couple or a single person.

Most homes in England are quite small, with an average of three bedrooms. Some families just take one student and others may take two or more. Homestays are within reasonable travelling distance of Rell

In your homestay, you will have:

- · a single bedroom with access to a desk or table for study
- · meals according to your type of accommodation
- · access to a bath or shower
- · clean towels and bed linen each week.

Please remember that a homestay is not like a hotel. Many customs and routines will be different. To make the most of living in a homestay, you should respect your hosts and try to adapt to their lifestyle.

To ensure your homestay hosts can welcome you on arrival, please confirm your arrival time well in advance to accommodation@bellenglish.com for Cambridge or info.london@bellenglish.com for London.

Please note: You will not be able to use your homestay host's kitchen to prepare your own meals.

Residential accommodation

If you have chosen residential accommodation, your pre-arrival information and licence to occupy agreement will be sent to you separately.

Please note: towels are not provided in residential accommodation.

Renting accommodation

If you wish to rent your own accommodation, please note that you will need to budget for council tax, water, gas and electricity bills as they are not included in the monthly rent. Normally students will have to pay six months' rent in advance. It is also normal to pay a refundable damage deposit equivalent to two months' rent.





Useful documents

You must show the following documents to immigration officers:

- your Bell Booking Confirmation and any sponsorship letters if applicable
- proof that you have paid your course fees and accommodation
- · In addition, for non-EU students:
- · your passport, with any necessary visas
- proof that you have enough money to support yourself while you are in Britain
- · proof of accommodation
- · your return tickets.

Once you arrive you may need to register with the police in Britain. This is a normal procedure and we can give you information about how to do this when you arrive.

Taxi transfer

Your first day

Arrival time on the first day of lessons:

· Bell Cambridge: 8.30am - 8.45am

· Bell London: 8.00am - 8.15am

Remember to bring your passport or ID card. You will be assessed and placed in a class appropriate to your English level. There will be a short introduction to the centre, the area and the UK, plus a tour and chance to meet the staff.

Students' welfare

At Bell, we consider our students' wellbeing to be of the utmost importance. If you have concerns or questions about any aspect of your Bell experience, there is always a member of staff available to help.

Students aged 16 and 17

Students aged 16 and 17 are considered children under UK law and at Bell we aim to provide an even greater level of care to these students. To ensure their safety and wellbeing:

- all staff, homestay hosts and taxi drivers working with Bell have undergone DBS checks.
- We provide on-site supervision for students for students aged 16 and 17 living in Bell residential accommodation
- we operate an evening return time of 23.00 for all students aged 16 and 17, living in Bell accommodation.
- we do not allow students aged 16 and 17 to visit our adult residences for students aged over 18.

We require written permission from parents if students under the age of 18 wish to:

- travel independently to visit other cities in the UK or Europe
- · move out of Bell accommodation
- · book a holiday during their course
- be absent from their accommodation overnight

Social activities

Your course fee includes a range of free social events, including up to two free trips or activities every two weeks. We will give you full information when you arrive in the Activity Zone. For details of current activities please visit www.bellenglish.com/english-16/language-action

Under-18s

As part of the social programme, some trips and excursions are organised by local travel companies. If you are under 18 and want to participate in one of these day trips you will need a Non-Bell Trip consent form for under 18s signed by your parents. Email the signed form to customerservice@bellenglish.com before you arrive or bring it with you to give to staff on arrival.

Please note, Bell does not book under 18s for overnight trips.

Course certificate

You will receive a course report and course certificate (subject to a minimum of 80% attendance) giving details of your attendance, academic progress and end-of-course assessment.

Lunch at the schools

Lunch at Bell Cambridge

Students can buy a wide range of refreshments in the dining room throughout the day, including hot and cold food, salads, sandwiches and paninis, puddings, fruit and cakes. Special diets can be catered for such as halal, vegetarian and gluten free. Please speak to the chef for any dietary requests.

Food can be paid for using cash, a credit or debit card, Goole Pay, Apple Pay etc in exactly the same way as any other food or retail outlet. We recommend about £50 each week for lunches and snacks. If you are travelling as part of a group with pre-paid lunches, we will explain how this works on your first morning.

Paying for meals in Bell London

Bell London does not provide meals, but there are many snack bars and restaurants near by. You will need at least £70 each week for lunches and snacks. When eating out, you should allow at least £20 for a one-course meal and drink.

Accommodation

If you wish to change your Bell-arranged accommodation after you arrive, please speak to our reception staff. You will need to give at least four weeks' paid notice and pay an administration fee for any change to your original booking. For more information, please see www.bellenglish.com/termsconditions

Extending your accommodation

If you have booked accommodation for only part of your stay, you can extend it once you arrive for an administration fee and subject to availability.

Holidays

To book a holiday after you arrive, please speak to a member of staff in reception to arrange this.

- For bookings of less than 12 weeks, we do not normally allow holidays.
- For bookings of more than 12 weeks, two weeks' holiday can be taken for each 12 weeks of course booked.

An administration fee is payable and you must give four weeks' notice. To retain your accommodation, full accommodation fees are payable even during holiday periods. To retain your homestay room, you will need to pay full accommodation fees for the first week of your holiday and 50% for any following weeks.

Please note:

- Holiday dates cannot be changed on courses with fixed term dates such as the University Foundation Programme, Masters Preparation Programme, Cambridge English: Advanced, and Cambridge English: First.
- Holidays cannot be taken during Intensive Exam Preparation courses, with fixed start and end dates.

The minimum age

The minimum age for students joining Bell adult courses is 16. Students under the age of 18 are considered children by UK law and we require additional information and consent to be able to accept these students onto our adult courses.

We strongly recommend that students aged 16 and 17 stay in Bell arranged accommodation



Independent accommodation

By choosing not to book Bell arranged accommodation you are giving permission for the student to live independently in the UK If a student is not staying in Bell arranged accommodation, we must receive full contact details of where the student is staying. We accept no responsibility for accommodation not booked through us



Taxi for under 18

We strongly recommend that students aged 16 or 17 book the Bell taxi transfer service By choosing not to book the Bell taxi transfer service, you are giving permission for the student to travel to the UK independently. We cannot be held responsible for the safety of under 18s who have not booked the Bell taxi transfer service



Airline guidance on under 18

Some airlines do not allow students under the age of 18 to travel without an adult. Please check the airline's guidelines before booking flights



Social activities

Students aged 16 and 17 are able to join all social activities arranged and supervised by Bell



Returning from day trips

Students aged 16 and 17 can travel independently within the UK on day trips, providing they return to their accommodation by 23:00 hours.



Medical emergency for under 18

If a student under 18 needs urgent medical attention and their parents/guardians cannot be contacted, Bell will act in loco parentis and will arrange for a doctor to give any medical treatment considered necessary, as well as authorise the administration of an anaesthetic and operation



Medical care

If you need to see a doctor or dentist while at Bell, we can arrange this for you. You may have to pay for treatment immediately, but you might be able to claim medical costs through our insurance. Remember to get a receipt from the doctor or dentist. Check your full insurance policy at

In the UK home visits by doctors are unusual - they will only be made for serious emergencies and are very expensive.

Course extension

To extend your course or add 1 to 1 lessons, please speak to reception staff. All additions should be paid for at the time of booking.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in any enclosed public area in the UK, e.g shops and restaurants. Smoking is also not permitted in the Bell centres or in any area close to the buildings. If you choose to smoke, please do so in the designated smoking areas (Bell Cambridge only).

Staying in touch

All students have free wireless and internet access in the study centre. In your accommodation, there may be a small charge for internet access, where available.

Student Route

As a Student Route visa sponsor, Bell has special duties, set by UK Visas and Immigration, that must be adhered to. Therefore, if you have a Student Route visa, in addition to following Bell's standard rules, policies and procedures, you must:

- · agree any course changes with our academic staff
- · inform Bell immediately if you change your address or contact details in the UK
- · inform Bell immediately if you wish to leave your course early or study at another school
- · give Bell a copy of your boarding pass as proof that you have left the country on completion of your studies.

Spending money

We recommend you bring cash or credit card. Visa and Mastercard are widely accepted and you can obtain cash with these cards in most banks in the UK. You will need to know your PIN number. American Express is not widely accepted and cannot be used to obtain cash in the UK. We strongly advise that you do not bring large amounts of cash with you. No pocket money can be transferred to Bell in advance.

Bank accounts

If you are studying at Bell for several months, you may be able to open a UK bank account. We can give you further details when you arrive.
