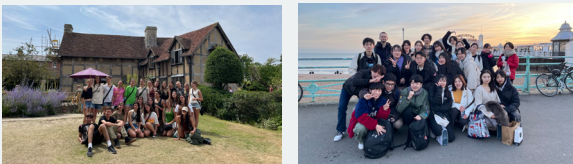
Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday Socials
